



4-H ORGANIZATION

School Clubs- (4th-12th grades) organized in schools. Club meetings are held during the school day. Elementary Schools are held in the classroom and SMS and FCHS will be held on Club Day.

4-H Shooting Sports Club- Club focusing on Archery, Rifle, Pistol, Black Powder and Shotgun. All coaches have been trained and certified by the University of Kentucky State 4-H Program. Call for current meeting times. Club Coordinator Valerie Hurst.

4-H Horse Program- Offers an opportunity for youth with or without horses to participate in field trips, educational activities, demonstrations, clinics, fundraising and community service projects. All with an emphasis on Natural Horsemanship principles and practice. All educational opportunities led by leader trained and certified by the University of Kentucky State 4-H Program. 4-H Livestock Program- Offers an opportunity for youth with or without livestock to participate in educational meetings, activities, clinics, and field trips. Focus is on livestock judging and exhibiting. All volunteers certified and trained by the University of Kentucky State 4-H Program. Call for more information. 4-H Dairy Club- Offers an opportunity for youth with or without Dairy animals to participate in meetings, educational field trips, clinics, and other fun activities under the direction of certified volunteer. All volunteers certified and trained by the University of Kentucky State 4-H Program. All youth required to complete 6 educational hours under the supervision of a certified volunteer. 4-H Project Workshops—Offers an opportunity for youth to attend a workshop geared toward a specific 4-H youth development core area.
Examples: Sewing, Cooking, Arts & Crafts, Woodworking & Electrical, Photography, etc.



4-H ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

Speech Contest- learn to write, organize and deliver a speech effectively. County, District and State Events.

Demonstration Contest- learn to organize and present information demonstrating a skill or activity. County, District and State Events.

4-H Fair- youth have an opportunity to exhibit and display items they have made themselves. Qualifying exhibits are entered in the 4-H Cloverville at the Kentucky State Fair.

Kentucky State Fair- 4-H Fair champions may exhibit at the state fair. Livestock & Dairy Exhibitors have the opportunity for State Fair participation.

4-H Camp- youth 9-19 participate in a 5 day overnight camp at North Central 4-H Camp. Classes include canoeing, riflery, archery, nature, high/low ropes, recreation, swimming and much more.

Teen Summit- 6th- 8th grade youth participate in a 3-day overnight conference at Lake Cumberland Leadership Center where they can experience social, educational and leadership programs.

Teen Conference- 9th-12th grade participate in a 4-day conference held on the UK campus. Social, educational, citizenship & leadership programs are offered.

Issues Conference- 10th and 11th grades participate in a 4-day conference at the Lake Cumberland Leadership Center for teens to learn the processing skills needed for identifying and carrying out community programs.

Achievement Program- to recognize 4-H participants who have outstanding accomplishments and to provide incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills and abilities. Three levels of achievements. They are Bronze Honor, Silver Honor, and Gold Honor.

Individual Projects- activities centered around a specific subject. Youth accomplish educational activities with the assistance of an adult or teen. Many completed projects can be entered in the 4-H fair. Project selection should not be based only on interest, but also on the ability to complete the activities.
Arts, Electric, Entomology, Foods, Forestry, Geology, Home Environment, Horticulture, Needlework, Photography, Sewing, Wood Science and much more.
