 - Picked up 13 pigs in Cuba
 - Landed in Tampa Bay
 - 13 became 700
- Native American developed a taste for pig meat

- Mummies
- "Salt used to preserve the dead could be used to preserve food for the living"
- Domestication of pigs
 - Due to thriftiness pork became the meat of choice
- Techniques brought over from Europe
- 100 years ago, this was simply a ham




Country Ham; A History

- Smithfield Hams
 - Pigs fed peanuts from Smithfield,
 VA
- Mr. Gwaltney's Pet Ham
 - 1902
 - Left behind after clearing out the ham house
 - Isle of Wight Museum
 - Never been in refrigeration




Country Ham; A History

- "Country Ham" first appeared in the early 1940's

- Country ham became regionalized

- National Country Ham Association



- Due to Country Ham being aged in warm temperatures, and containing fat and protein they are perfect food sources for many insects
- Ham Mites
- Larder Beetles
- Red Legged Ham Beetles
- Cheese Skippers













How to control these pests

- Sanitation
- Freezing
- Limit the contact to the ham from people, dogs, cats, etc
- Light covering of oil
- Ozone
 - Very corrosive
- Bad cases use:
 - Methyl bromide
 - Sulfuryl fluoride
